## Homework in The Early Years

### Foundation Stage

At the beginning of each half term, class teachers in Reception set the 'Homework Passport' activities which are linked to the seven areas of learning. You should choose to complete at least two of the activities but you can choose to do more. These can be completed in your homework book or, if they are a model or a project, they can be completed separately. These pieces of homework can be handed to the teacher any time before the date given inside the booklet.

Your homework is due to be completed and returned by:  
**Thursday 30th March 2017**

Please remember you should try to complete at least **two** pieces of homework, one from each subject.

### Prime Areas

- At home you can read a range of non-fiction texts with your child about buildings.
- Take your child for a walk around your local area and discuss different types of buildings and businesses you can see, as well as the variety of materials used to build the structures.
- Work with your child to build a house using junk modelling.

### Specific Areas

- Work with your child to draw a map of your local environment and label it.
- Practise recognising and ordering the numbers 1-20. Continue to practise matching a numeral to the correct value and begin to work on number bonds to 20, for example:  $19 + 1$ ,  $18 + 2$ ,  $17 + 3$ .
- Identify 2D and 3D shapes and talk about their properties, drawing attention to the shapes' vertices and sides.
- Help your child to practise writing their name, numbers, letters and simple CVC words correctly, for example: cat, ran, bug, tin.
