1. Make a model of a clock and learn o'clock, half past and quarter past.
2. Practise playing shopkeepers with an adult using real coins or paper cut outs. Focus on the value of each coin.
Challenge: Write some addition or subtractions which = £1.00
3. Create a picture to show the 12 months in the year.
4. Take a piece of fruit. With the help of an adult can you cut it in halves then quarters? Take photos or draw and label.
5. Write all the doubles to 10.
For example $1+1=2$.
