3. Create a mini-beast model using recycled objects.
4. Design your very own bug costume.
5. Draw a plant or flower. Using a pencil, sketch the plant in detail. Use colours or paints to complete the detail on your plant.

Choose 2 or more to complete:

1. Make a model of a clock. Practise telling the time using o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past.
2. Choose a number between 1 and 100. Have a look at the chosen number and round to the nearest 10.
3. Choose a number between 1 and 30. Can you double this number? Can you halve this number?
4. Collect some different types of leaves together. Can you measure the length of each leaf accurately using a ruler? Stick the leaves onto a piece of paper in order of length and write their length beside them.
