- 1. Find out about one of these persons: Rosa Parks, Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole or Christopher Columbus. Write about what they did and what has happened as a result of their actions.
- 2. Draw a sketch of the Great Fire of London add lots of fiery colours!
- Create a map of London in 1666 showing the location of the River Thames, Pudding Lane bakery and where the fire spread. This could be drawn or collaged. Alternatively, you could create a 3D map with miniature buildings e.g. Houses of Parliament, Pudding Lane bakery etc.
- 4. Why is Rosa Park significant? Use the internet to find out all about her.

Please remember you should try to complete at least three pieces of homework, one from each subject.

Maths

- 1. Learn your 3D shapes and then go on a shape hunt around your house. You could draw, label or photograph the shapes that you have found.
- 2. Double multiples of 10 up to 200. e.g. double 30 is 60. Do you know the corresponding halves?
- 3. Design a plan for a square room using only 2D shapes. Use different shapes to represent the furniture in your room (e.g. circle for chair, rectangle for bed, etc.). You can decide what furniture to have in your room. Label the items in your room.
- 4. Find 24 small objects in your home (buttons, coins, matchsticks, etc.). How many different ways can you find to make equal groups of the objects? Write down the combinations.
- 5. What is your favourite number? How many different ways can you make this number? Can you make your favourite number using different number operations, + x ÷ (e.g. Number 3, 1 + 1 + 1; 1 x 3; 4 1, etc.
