Our topic is called:

We are Project Managers

The children will apply computational thinking to the task of managing a complex project. They will identify the components of the project and develop a timeline to track the progress. They will also consider the strategies to ensure the quality of this project.



Religious Education

Our focus this half term is on **Christianity**.

As a class pupils will find out about the different practices and ways of life followers of the Christian religion. The children will also be discussing how the Christian beliefs have had different effects on individuals, communities and societies. They will prepare a guide depicting the Christians Christmas celebration.



Reading

Listen to your child read every day (at least 25 mins). Question them to ensure that the text is understood. Read stories, poems and non-fiction books, and take time to explain the meanings of different words. Visit the local library.

Take your child on trips to places similar to those in the book to help embed the vocabulary he/she is experiencing.



Spelling & Homework

You will receive a Homework Passport detailing projects and questions for you and your child to complete at home. All homework is carefully chosen to link closely with your child's school learning.

Spellings will be sent home on Fridays: the children will have 1 week to find out the meaning of each word as well as learn the correct spelling for their spelling test on the following Friday.

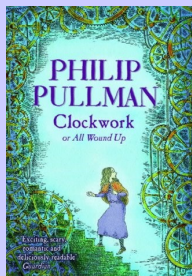
Successful Learners

English

Our focus text is:

The children will be writing in different styles linked to their class texts; and learning how to check and edit their work. There will be a strong focus on reading comprehension, handwriting, vocabulary, grammar and spelling.

At The Devonshire Hill Nursery and Primary School, we strive to ensure our children are prepared for the world in which they will grow up to live in.

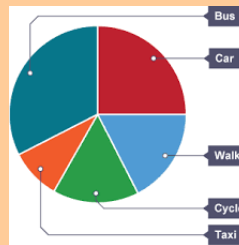

Mathematics

The children will be using all of the 4 operations to solve word problems with multi steps.

We will interpret and construct pie charts and line graphs and use these to solve problems. Also we will round any whole number to a required degree of accuracy and use negative numbers in context, and calculate intervals across zero e.g. temperature.



The children will multiply multi-digit numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the efficient written method of long multiplication, and divide numbers up to 4 digits by a two-digit whole number using the efficient written method of long division.

Finally we will be interpreting division remainders as whole number remainders, fractions, or by rounding, as appropriate; and identify common factors, common multiples and prime numbers.
