Home Learning in The Early Years Foundation Stage

At the beginning of each half term, class teachers in Reception set the 'Home Learning Passport' activities which are linked to the seven areas of learning. You should choose to complete at least two of the activities but you can choose to do more. These can be completed in your homework book or, if they are a model or a project, they can be completed separately. These pieces of homework can be handed to the teacher any time before the date given inside the booklet.

Your home learning is due to be completed and returned by:

Please remember you should try to complete at least two pieces of homework, one from each subject.

Specific Areas

- Use describing words to write about all of the different mini beasts you can find in your local environment. How do they look? How do they move?
- Make a tally chart showing the different mini beasts you can find. Which is the most and least common mini beast where you live? How many mini beasts can you find altogether?
- Use the internet to research different mini beasts and go on a mini beast hunt to explore different habitats.
- Make a model of a habitat using recyclable items from around your house.

Prime Areas

- Talk to your child about why it is important to look after animals in the environment and create a list of rules for how you could help to keep animals and mini beasts safe.
- Practise throwing and catching a ball with your child when you visit the park. Allow them to experiment with different sized balls if you can and help them improve their control and co-ordination.
