Choose 3 or more to complete:

- How would you prioritise the different ways in which the Romans have influenced our lives today? Which of their inventions have had the greatest impact on our modern lives.
- How do Greek and Roman architecture compare with each other?
- Do you agree that Archimedes work has changed our lives today? Explain your answer.
- Create a costume suitable for a Roman woman or man; write a brief description of when it would be worn, e.g. a battle costume, celebratory costume or everyday outfit.
- Create a cartoon strip about a famous story from Myths and Legends.

Don't forget to read your Home/School Reading Books, practice your Weekly Spelling Words in time for your test and learn your Times Tables.

Please remember you should try to complete at least three pieces of homework, from each subject.

English
