This work must be handed to your class teacher any time before or on the date given in this passport.

Home Learning for **Mathematics** and **Spelling** will be given every **Friday**, and will reflect the learning objectives from current lessons. This work should be completed neatly in your **Blue 'Home Maths Book'** and returned for marking by Wednesday of the following week.

- Write 10 sentences using verbs and adverbs. Remember a verb is a doing or action word and an adverb describes a verb. E.g. He walked slowly to school.
- Write a paragraph to persuade someone that The Devonshire Hill Nursery and Primary School is the best school in the world!

Don't forget to read your **Home/School Reading Books**, practice your **Weekly Spelling Words** in time for your test and learn your **Times Tables**.

Focus Figure: Captain Scott

Focus Text: *Huckleberry Hero*
- by A R Chuzzlewit

- Make a model of a skeleton and research the names of the main bones in the human body.
- Make a model of the human eye. Find out about how we are able to see.
- Use a computer to find out about the human ear. You can present your findings using PowerPoint, Pictures or Notes.
- Make a collage about 'Healthy Eating'.
- Research the importance of exercise and why it is important for humans to exercise. Draw or use pictures from the computer or magazines to illustrate different exercises.
- Make a model to show how a joint works to allow our bones to move.
