Home Learning Passport

Home Learning Passports are given at the start of each new term. This passport contains a selection of activities for you to complete at home. These activities support English and Topic learning from the curriculum covered during the current term.

You should complete:

- At least three activities for English
- At least three activities for Topic
- All written work must be completed neatly in your Yellow 'Home Writing Book'
- Models and other creative pieces of work are to be completed and presented separately

This work must be handed to your class teacher any time before or on the date given in this passport.

Home Learning for Mathematics and Spelling will be given every Friday, and will reflect the learning objectives from current lessons. This work should be completed neatly in your Blue 'Home Maths Book' and returned for marking by Wednesday of the following week. Spelling words will be tested the following Friday.

English

Focus Text: 'The Village that vanished' - by Anne Grifalconi

These activities must be completed in your yellow 'Home Writing Book'. This book is checked by your teacher every Wednesday. **Choose 3 or more to complete:**

- Write a poem about your local community.
- Research different community celebrations from around the world. Create a fact file of your one of your favourite celebrations. Include a picture/collage/model to show a feature of your chosen celebration this could include a costume worn in Rio Carnival, a Diwali lamp, Chinese New Year decoration.
- Write a set of instructions on how to play the ball game that you are practising in PE - Rounders.
- Create a book review of your English Focus Text 'The Village that Vanished'. Don't forget to include the book's title, the Authors name, a blurb and a review to tell people about your favourite part of the story. Illustrate your review with a picture of your favourite scene.
- Design a leaflet or poster which teaches people how to survive deep in the jungle. Use the story of The Village that Vanished as inspiration for your poster.

Don't forget to read your **Home/School Reading Books**, practice your **Weekly Spelling Words** in time for your test and practise your **Times Tables** using **TT Rockstars**.

Choose 3 or more to complete.

- Paint or draw a picture of your local area – think about the colours you could use and the different details you could add to your picture.
- Choose a local landmark to research and make a 3D model. Some examples could be Devonshire Hill Primary School, Bruce Castle, Alexandra Palace. Write a caption to explain why your chosen landmark is important to the your local community.
- Design or make a sculpture which could be displayed in your local park. You could use one material or multiple materials. Write a short caption to explain what inspired your design
- Research Gabriel Fahrenheit. Try to use a variety of sources - for example internet research and books from the local library. Create a fact file about him.
- Design your own invention. Create a labelled drawing of it. Write a caption to explain how would your invention have an impact on your local community?
