
Child Genius

Towards the end of Spring 1 term Year 6 had a very important visit from Yvonne Lawson, founder of the Godwin Lawson Foundation. Year 6 listened intently to the 'Breaking Barriers, Building Futures' assembly. During this time Yvonne Lawson told the story of her son Godwin, his success in education and in football and



how he tragically lost his life to knife crime. Yvonne's message to our pupils was powerful and clear. Knife crime destroys lives. Godwin was a promising footballer with passion and drive. His life was taken by a fatal stab wound. We hope that by understanding Godwin's story our Year 6 pupils can make the right decisions to keep themselves and their friends safe.
