This work must be handed to your class teacher any time before or on the date given in this passport.

Home Learning for Mathematics and Spelling will be given every Friday, and will reflect the learning objectives from current lessons. This work should be completed neatly in your Blue 'Home Maths Book' and returned for marking by Wednesday of the following week.

Spelling words will be tested the following Friday.

- Write about your Easter holidays using adjectives to describe what you did.
- Keep a diary for a week. Write about any fun things you do and maybe draw some pictures to match. Remember to write in sentences using a capital letter and a full stop.
- Imagine you have been given a wild animal as a pet. Write about how you would look after it.

Don't forget to read your Home/School Reading Books and record this in your Reading Record. You should practice your Weekly Spelling Words in time for your test and learn your Times Tables.
