Home Learning Passports are given at the start of each new term. This passport contains a selection of activities for you to complete at home. These activities support English and Topic learning from the curriculum covered during the current term.

You should complete:

- At least three activities for English
- At least three activities for Topic
- All written work must be completed neatly in your Yellow 'Home Writing Book'
- Models and other creative pieces of work are to be completed and presented separately

This work must be handed to your class teacher any time before or on the date given in this passport.

Home Learning for Mathematics and Spelling will be given every Friday, and will reflect the learning objectives from current lessons. This work should be completed neatly in your Blue 'Home Maths Book' and returned for marking by Wednesday of the following week.

Spelling words will be tested the following Friday.

English

Focus Text: 'Man on the Moon' - by Simon Bartram
'A Squash and a Squeeze' by Julia Donaldson

These activities must be completed in your yellow 'Home Writing Book'. This book is checked by your teacher every Wednesday.

Choose 3 or more to complete:

- Write a list of questions you could ask the Author, Simon Bartram. Remember to include capital letters and question marks.
- Write your favourite traditional tale. Remember to use nouns, adjectives, adverbs, punctuation marks and conjunctions.
- Write a diary for one week. Use the past tense in your sentences. Eg: I went to the shop and I bought a lollipop. Include lots of verbs and some adverbs.
- Write a review of a book or film that you have enjoyed. Give reasons why you liked it and try to suggest who you think would be interested in it.
- Design a poster which would encourage your friends and family to read one of your favourite books. Don't forget to include the book title, the author and some drawings of the characters.

Topic: 'The Earth—Our World'

Focus Figure: David Attenborough

Focus Text: 'Curious George Plants a Tree' - by M & HA Reys

Choose 3 or more to complete:

- Choose a habitat. Research which animals live there and create a food chain to show how they interact.
- Explain how where you live is similar and different to another place in the world. Where would you rather live? Why?
- Use the internet to find out about Neil Armstrong and the famous Apollo 11 launch to the moon from Florida in 1969.
- Imagine you are David Attenborough and you have just discovered a new species of animal. Make a model of this animal.
- Design a poster which teaches people about something they could do to look after our world. Some examples could be, recycling, walking to school vs driving to school, caring for animals, not littering.

Don't forget to read your **Home/School Reading Books**, practice your **Weekly Spelling Words** in time for your test and practise your **Times Tables** using **T T Rockstars**.
