Men's health is in crisis. Men are dying on average 4.5 years earlier than women, and for largely preventable reasons.

A growing number of men – around 10.8 million globally – are facing life with a prostate cancer diagnosis. Globally, testicular cancer is the most common cancer among young men. And across the world, one man dies by suicide every minute of every day, with males accounting for 69% of all suicides.

Movember, as an organisation, is uniquely placed to address this crisis on a global scale. They fund ground-breaking projects all over the world, engaging men where they are to understand what works best and accelerate change.

National Games Day was started in 2007: this free event grew out of an idea to attempt to set a world's record for the number of people playing the same game at the same time at libraries around the world. National Games Day became International Games Day (IGD) in 2012, International Games Week (IGW) in 2017, and finally International Games Month (IGM) in 2022. It has grown to include events on all seven continents. Even today, it is still raising awareness of games and gaming in libraries to publishers and the public. This event has become a valuable way for libraries and their communities to join together and engage in play each year.

International Games Month is run by volunteers from American Libraries Association (ALA), Games and Gaming Round Table (GameRT), Australian Library and Information Association, Nordic Game Week, and L'Associazione Italiana Biblioteche.

Games and play have long been established as a fundamental part of the social, emotional, and creative growth in children, but can also be hugely beneficial in adults. Games continue to fill an important purpose for our well-being. They let us relax, explore, and imagine in ways we might not always find in our daily life.

“Games are fantastic for learning at any age, but they are particularly important for young learners. Research has shown that games are essential for healthy development in early childhood and beyond.

Play lets children practise what they know, and also what they don't. It allows them to experiment through trial and error, find solutions to problems, work out the best strategies, and build new confidence and skills. In our busy lives, it can be easy to forget the value of play. We often think play is not a good use of time and children should be doing some 'proper' learning instead.” Cambridge English

Muswell Hill Photographic Society The Members' 2023 Print Exhibition

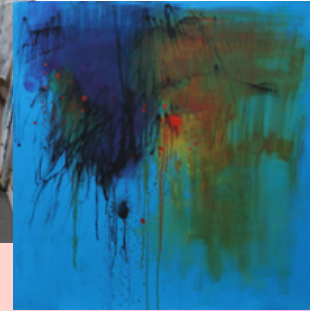

This exhibition showcases a small selection of work by its members. There are around 60 framed and mounted prints together with 29 triptychs covering many styles and different subjects.



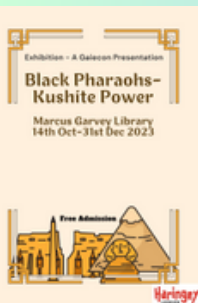
