



Local Schools Shine at Learning in Tottenham (LIT) Talent Show

LIT recently hosted the first Learning in Tottenham (LIT) Talent Show, bringing together seven local schools for an exciting showcase of young talent. The event took place on 1st July at the London Academy of Excellence Tottenham (LAET), providing a platform for pupils to demonstrate their skills and creativity.

The LIT Talent Show featured performances from pupils and students representing Lea Valley Primary, Lancasterian, Devonshire Hill, Risley, Mulberry Academy Woodside, St Francis de Sales, and LAET itself. The event was judged by a distinguished panel including Shocka, Bola Soneye-Thomas (Headteacher of Roksley), Dawn Ferdinand (Headteacher of The Willow), and Coach Nathaniel from the Spurs Foundation. Adding to the excitement, special guest Tameka Empson, known for her role as Kim on *EastEnders*, presented the trophies to the winners and offered encouragement to all participants. Shocka also treated the audience to a special performance, further elevating the atmosphere.



The judges decided on two award categories: one for primary school pupils and one for older students. Bosath from St Francis de Sales was awarded the primary category prize for his remarkable blindfolded piano performance. Emily from Mulberry Academy Woodside won the secondary category with a powerful rendition of Whitney Houston's I Who Have Nothing.

Maria Kokotsis, Headteacher of Lea Valley Primary School, said, "What a great show. 
